Sub : Earmarking of funds for minority beneficiaries.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the subject mentioned above and to inform the decision to revise para 1.5 of the IAY guidelines with a view to making a provision for earmarking of funds for BPL Minorities in each state.

After adding a clause in this regard, the existing provision and revised provision of para 1.5 would be as under.

Necessary modifications in the monitoring formats I(a), I(b) and I(c) available at the end of the IAY guidelines have also been carried out accordingly, a copy of which is enclosed.

The amount to be earmarked under IAY, for the Minorities during the current year is Rs.581.20 crore for construction of 2.30 Lakhs houses. A statement showing the state-wise earmarking of funds and the targets to be achieved during the current year, is enclosed. District-wise allocation of funds and the targets may be decided by each state based on the concentration of Minorities in the districts or so. The amount mentioned in the Statement against each State under IAY is to be utilized and the targets to be achieved only out of the existing allocation of each district and no additional funds would be provided for the purpose.
